UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS:

ECONOMIC IMPACT PAYMENTS:

The **CARES Act** will provide **direct payments to tax filers** in response to the COVID-19 outbreak. Eligible taxpayers who filed tax returns for either 2019 or 2018 will automatically receive an economic impact payment. **If you have not received** your CARES Act payment, you **must act by November 21st, 2020 by 3p.m. ET** to claim your payment. <u>Click here to learn more.</u>

LANDLORDS:

Governor Whitmer established the **Eviction Diversion Program**, which outlines a process for renters to get fast financial assistance or establish a manageable payment plan to keep Michiganders in their homes. Rental assistance under the Eviction Diversion Program will be available until December 31st, 2020. Click here to learn more.

Multi-family property owners with mortgages backed by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac who enter new or modified forbearance agreements must inform their tenants in writing that the tenants cannot be evicted for nonpayment of rent during the COVID-19 pandemic. Landlords in forbearance must inform tenants of other protections, including at least a 30-day notice to vacate, no fees or penalties for not paying rent and the flexibility to repay owed rent over time and not in a lump sum. If you have a **federally backed mortgage** on a rental property, you may be eligible for hardship assistance programs. Contact your lender right away to ask what options may be available.

EVICTIONS:

If you are facing eviction and/or received a Notice to Quit or Demand for Possession, you may qualify for the **Eviction Diversion Program**, which outlines a process for renters to get fast rental assistance. Rental assistance under the Eviction Diversion Program will be available beginning July 16. <u>Click here to learn more.</u>

Current eviction moratoriums do not release you from any obligation under your lease. This means **you still owe your landlord any rent that becomes due during this period.** While your landlord cannot file an eviction now, after the emergency passes your landlord can either start or continue your eviction case.

Domestic Relations Cases:

Circuit Courts continue to hear limited domestic relations matters. These being kept personal protection order matters and family law (divorce/custody/support) matters with emergency components.

Non-emergency hearings/conferences will be rescheduled, and you should receive a notice in the mail after the courthouses re-open. Call the courthouses and/or check online for updates regarding rescheduling and/or to determine when the courthouses will resume normal operations.

CHILDCARE:

Capital Area United Way (CAUW) reactivated its Emergency Relief Fund (ERF) and partnered with Capital Area Community Services (CACS) to administer the funds. STUDENT LOAN DEBT:

Federal Student Loan Debt payments have <u>automatically been suspended</u> through December 31, 2020. Interest will not accrue during this time. Borrowers may continue to pay principal debt if they choose. This policy only affects federally held student loan debt. This policy **does not** apply to private student loan debt. AT&T will not terminate service of any wireless, phone or broadband residential or small business customer due to an inability to pay your bill. All late payment fees will be waived.
